Adult Reentry and Employment Strategic Planning Program, BJA FY 18 (CFDA No. 16.812)

Purpose: To fund strategic planning grants that will replicate the best practices identified by a BJA pilot program for reducing recidivism and increasing job readiness for offenders returning from incarceration.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; small businesses; for-profit organizations, other than small businesses; and public or Indian housing authorities.

Funding: \$1.2 million; awards of up to \$200,000.

Advanced Transportation and Congestion Management Technologies Deployment Initiative (CFDA No. 20.200)

Purpose: To develop model deployment sites for large-scale installation and operation of advanced transportation technologies to improve safety, efficiency, system performance, and infrastructure return on investment.

Eligibility: State and local governments; transit agencies; metropolitan planning organizations representing a population of over 200,000; other political subdivisions of state or local government, such as port or publicly owned toll authorities; and multijurisdictional groups or consortia of research or academic institutions.

Funding: \$60 million; awards of up to \$12 million.

Agriculture and Food Research Initiative— Education and Workforce Development (CFDA No. 10.310)

Purpose: To help develop the next generation of research, education, and extension professionals through professional development opportunities, training undergraduate students, and fellowships for pre- and post-doctoral candidates.

Eligibility: State agricultural stations; colleges and universities, including junior colleges; university research foundations; other research institutions and organizations; federal agencies; national laboratories; private organizations or corporations; individuals; 1994 land-grant institutions; and Hispanic-serving agricultural colleges and universities.

Funding: \$24.1 million; awards of up to \$500,000.

Announcement of the Availability of Funds for Phase I New and Innovative Strategies (Tier 2) to Prevent Teenage Pregnancy and Promote Healthy Adolescence (CFDA No. 93.297)

Purpose: To develop and test new and innovative strategies to prevent teen pregnancy, promote healthy adolescence, and address youth sexual risk through protective factors.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; small businesses; for-profit organizations, other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: Not specified; awards between \$250,000 and \$375,000.

Announcement of the Availability of Funds for Phase I Replicating Programs (Tier 1) Effective in the Promotion of Healthy Adolescence and the Reduction of Teenage Pregnancy and Associated Risk Behaviors (CFDA No. 93.297)

Purpose: To replicate programs that have shown to be effective in preventing adolescent risk behaviors, including preventing teen pregnancy, and use them on a larger scale.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; small businesses; for-profit organizations, other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: Not specified; awards between \$200,000 and \$500,000.

Higher Education Multicultural Scholars Program (MSP) (CFDA No. 10.220)

Purpose: To increase the multicultural diversity of the scientific and professional food and agricultural workforce and improve the educational achievement of all Americans by providing colleges and universities with competitive grants.

Eligibility: Land-grant institutions, colleges, and universities with significant minority enrollment; other colleges and universities; and institutions or research foundations maintained by an eligible college or university.

Funding: \$945,000.

National Fish Passage Program (CFDA No. 15.608)

Purpose: To work to provide fish and other aquatic species with passages, such as road culverts, bridges, and water diversions; and to restore aquatic connections that benefit federal trust resources.

Eligibility: Unrestricted.

Funding: Not specified; awards between \$500,000 and \$2 million.

NEA Our Town, FY 19 (CFDA No. 45.024)

Purpose: To integrate arts, culture, and design activities to help strengthen communities and advance local economic, physical, and/or social outcomes.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, city, or township governments; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; and independent school districts.

Funding: Not specified; awards between \$25,000 and \$200,000.

Deadline: 8/9/2018.

Rural Community Development Initiative (RCDI) (CFDA No. 10.446)

Purpose: To fund projects in rural communities related to housing, community facilities, or community and economic development; requires matching funds.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; small businesses; for-profit organizations, other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: \$4 million; awards between \$50,000 and \$250,000.

STEM + Computing K-12 Education (CFDA No. 47.076)

Purpose: To research how students learn to think computationally to solve problems in science and mathematics; and to develop better instruction methods for integrating computation and STEM fields by expanding current teacher preparation or professional development activities that help teachers provide better instruction.

Eligibility: Unrestricted.

Funding: \$15 million.

Street Outreach Program (CFDA No. 93.557)

Purpose: To assist homeless youth with finding shelter and services, make healthy choices, and build permanent connections with families and other social networks.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; small businesses; for-profit organizations, other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: \$5.55 million; awards between \$90,000 and \$150,000.

Veterans Housing Rehabilitation and Modification Pilot Program (CFDA No. 14.278)

Purpose: To help low-income veterans with disabilities by modifying or rehabilitating their primary residences in order to help them regain or maintain their independence.

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations that primarily serve veterans or low-income individuals.

Funding: \$13.7 million; awards between \$700,000 and \$1 million.

White-Nose Syndrome Research Grants, FY 18 (CFDA No. 15.657)

Purpose: To investigate and manage issues related to White-Nose Syndrome in bats and help with bat conservation.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; small businesses; for-profit organizations, other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; individuals; and independent school districts.

Funding: \$1.5 million; awards between \$35,000 and \$300,000.
